Pvt Samuel Jack Nuckols, 21, now home on leave with his parents, Mr and Mrs S J Nuckols of Los Posas Rd will leave shortly for Ft Jackson SC where he has been assigned as a medic. Pvt Nuckols, a graduate of Oxnard High School, served as a combat medic in Korea for 14 months, arriving there is the

opening days of the campaign with the Eighth Cavalry Regiment. Prior to that he served for 20 months in Japan with the army of Occupation. He arrived in Seattle Washington on Sept 21 under the army's rotation program. Back to Basics—Definitions of Early Immigrant Groups



The following list will help introduce beginning researchers and others to groups of people who came to the New World in the very early years of settlement.

Hessians — German troops used by the British in the Revolutionary War, many of whom deserted and remained in America. Most were from Hesse, Germany (This is my Evilsizer (Ubelschusser) ancestor)

Huguenots — French Protestants who fled from persecution, mainly from 1685 onward. They first went to Prussia, the German Palatinate, Holland, England and then came to America. Those in the French West Indies escaped to the southern coast of America.

Mennonites — A Swiss Protestant group. Founded in 1525, who migrated to America by way of Alsace, England, and Russia. They

settled mainly in Ohio, Kansas, Pennsylvania and Minnesota.

Moravians — The United Brethren is a Protestant group formed in Bohemia about 1415 and spread to Poland, Prussia, Germany and England.

Palatines — in 1699, Louis XIV of France began persecuting German Protestants on the banks of the Rhine River, Queen Anne of England helped a group to come to America in 1708. More than 2,000 arrived in New York in 1710 and settled along the Hudson and Mohawk Rivers. Many went to Ireland.

Quakers — The Society of Friends was formed in England in 1648. Early restrictions brought them to New Jersey in 1675 and some 230 English Quakers founded Burlington, New Jersey in 1678. 1681 was the year William Penn was granted the territory of Pennsylvania, and within two years there

Scots-Irish — British rules placed the Descendents of the Pennsylvania Scots in northern counties of Ireland in the early part of the 17th century. Most came to America from 1718 until the Revolution. They settled in Pennsylvania first then moved south and then westward with the frontier.

Walloons — From southern Belgium, the language of the Walloons is a French dialect. Cornelius May of Flanders, Holland and about 30 to 40 families came to America in 1624 and established Fort Orange. It is now known as Albany, NY.
