Dog Swallows Diamond

“Dog and Diamond doing well”. This bulletin signed by J H Mercer, D.V.S. of New York was handed to J M Frazier, manager of the Bellevue-Stratford today. The principals in the case are a woman, widely known in New York and the southwest, a valuable Chihuahua dog, and a 1 1/2 carat diamond.

Two years ago a Mexican fled from Chihuahua and sought refuge with R C Nuckolls on his ranch, south of Dallas, Texas. Mr Nuckolls cared for him and in return the mexican gave him a very valuable pedigreed Chihuahua dog.

The dog is about eight inches long, Pedro is his name and he is very fond of Rock Candy. Mrs Nuckolls arrived in this city several days ago from New

York, where Pedro has been ill, and had been cared for by Dr Mercer, veterinarian.

Yesterday Mrs Nuckolls reported to the hotel manager that a diamond 1 1/2 carats in size had disappeared from her pendant. Pedro, in the meanwhile, became violently ill, and Dr Mercer was summoned from New York. Teeth marks of Pedro were observed on the pendant and it was believed that Pedro had eaten the diamond. He was placed under anaesthetic. A delicate incision was made and the costly gen removed. Pedro was sewed up and given a fine bandage.

Only family in this area around this time was Robert Clarence Nuckolls and wife Adelle. Descends from Lewis Nuckolls and Mary Hughes Watkins.

Research Tips - Checking the Averages

RESEARCH TIPS

If your research in the pioneering period (before 1850) has “dead ended”, it’s time for creative thinking. You may find these trends helpful in analyzing your problems.

There are approximately three generations per century.

Average age for men to marry was 24. They rarely married before 20.

The average for women to many was 20. They rarely married before 16.

First marriages were usually between couples near the same age. Women generally outlived their husbands, but old widowers frequently married much younger women who had never been married before~ (Remember those old Revolutionary War soldiers!)

Births generally occurred at two-year intervals. Frequently the first child was born a year after marriage. As a woman aged, the interval between births grew slightly. Child bearing generally ended around 45.

Families and neighbors generally migrated together from their old homes. Women rarely traveled alone.

Men usually married women from their neighborhood, but if a seemingly “strange” woman turned up, check the man’s former home. Often men returned to their prior residence to find a wife. *if* you can’t find an old parent, chances are he “went west” with a son.

If you have a male ancestor born ca 1840, strongly consider Civil War ser-

The info from her death certificate :
 Avilda Anna Nuckles born 3/25/1873 Ka-

nawha Co, WV. She was the daughter of Columbus Cornes, also born Kanawha Co, WV. She died Oct 11, 1945 in Kanawha Co, WV and was buried Oct 13, 1945 in Elkview, VA. She lived at 4220 Kan St, Spring Hill, WV and was married to John Nuckels when she died. No informant listed.

Her middle name was probably Virginia since her daughter named a child Virginia, and son John was also named after grandpa.

A check of ALL census records show no records of John, Anna, or even Columbus Cornes. So strange how these guys pop up on one census or a death record and cannot be identified, nor found earlier.

Studies show that after 1850, Ohio pioneers frequently moved to counties in other states on the same latitude as their home county in Ohio.

If your ancestor has a virtue name (e.g.: Patience, Silence), consider a New England heritage.

Children were often named for grandparents, both male and female.

Frequently a middle name or even a first name was the mother's or grandmother's maiden name especially if the name was repeated through several related families.—by Nan Card *Sandusky County Ohio Newsletter*, December 1990.
