### Last Will and Testament of Claudine M Nuckols

I, Claudine M Nuckols, St Matthews, Jefferson County, Kentucky, do make publish, and declare this to bemy last will and testament hereby revoking any and all wills and codicile heretofore made by me.

Item I - I direct that Lee E Cralle Company have charge of my funeral arrangements and that my remains be buried in the Cave Hill Cemetery at the grave reserved for me and that the date of my death be carved upon the largest existing monument.

Item II - I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon as practicable after my death.

Item III - All my household goods and personal effects including jewelry which I May own at the time of my death and which are not disposed of by a memorandum left by me, shall be sold by my executor at public auction within 30 days after the date of my death.

Item IV - All real property which I may own at the time of my death shall be sold by my executor within six months from the date of my death.

Item V - I further direct my eceutor to pay to Cave Hill Cemetery Company the sum of \$500 for the perpetual care of my six-grave lot in Section 17, Cave Hill Cemetery.

Item IX - I appoint the Citizens Fidel-

ity Bank and Trust Company executor of this will and trustee of my estate with full power to compromise or otherwise to settle or adjust any and all claims, charges, debts or demands against or in favor of my estate as fully as I could do if living; and if said executor shall find it necessary to sell any of my property for the purpose of administration, division, distribution, or the carrying out of any of the terms of this will, it shall have full power of sale, and the said executor shall not be required to secure any orders of court authorizing such sale or sales.

of them have passed on them what I have left then one or ones is to be given to the one or ones still living of my 3 children.

All pictures, Pony silver, cups and prizes and pony ribbons, are to be divided with my three (3) children or ones still living of my 3 children.

Pony tea spoons, 12 of them, 2 different kinds- 2 of each kind to each of my three (3) children. I ask that Franklyn Sr leave his 4 Pony tea spoons to his son Franklyn Jr when Franklyn Sr dies- I want this done sure.

The big kitchen cabinet is Franklyn's Sr's, he helped pay for it. The things in big cabinet are mine - sell them and put to estate. The cook books go to Cecile. The big old Bible is or J C, Jr- J.C please leave it to Sunny Boy when you die. The Walling book is for Franklyn Sr- please Franklyn Sr, leave it to Franklyn Jr when you died, let J C or Cecile keep it for him until he is grown or 22 years old, enough to appreciate it. He is the only g child with Walling in his name a ---- one. Dad's Bible and my Bible- one to Franklyn Sr, one to Cecile. See + not 3 pictures in living room they are to be sold-money to my estate

Dad's books- Lucille and Forty Thousand quotation - one to J C Jr and one to Cecile-these books are in my desk.

Dad's Prizes First Prize - Pen and Pencil set to J C Jr.

Second Prizes - (2 of them) Book ends and Ash Tray, one to Franklyn Sr and one to Cecile. These three prizes are always to be kept with my own three (3) children or the ones of them that are living. The 3 prizes are on my desk. Children take good care of them-Dad was so proud of them.

The Blue Bisque Boy and Girl (Pair) are for Franklin Sr, my son. An amount of equal value to J.C. Jr, my son, what ever he wants - this has nothing to do with Hazel's Afghan. To Hazel- my big Afghan with fancy border, the one she likes. (Remember kids, J.C and Hazel have no children). My big good Xmas things , elec trees and Santa's and such to be divided with my 3 children. Please children, give Naome, Charity and Raymond some little momento out of the house, not Bisque, give

Naome the nicest.

The big Coo-Coo-Clock is for Cecile (Big one).

The Bisque pair - Lady and Man sitting in chairs- Cecile is to have first chance at them if she wants them, and she is to have them for \$15 and money put to my estate.

There is a little sewing table on the 2nd floor (that he made at school) that belongs to Franklyn Sr.

My Admiral Tel set is J,C, Jr and Hazels, they bought it and loaned it to me, it is theirs. The big Elec (Westinghouse) fan on stand belongs to Franklyn and Mable, they bought it and loaned it to me, it is theirs. My George Washington bed spread to be sold- money put to my estate. My crocheted bed spread to be sold and money put to my estate. All my clothes to be sold-money to my estate. All of Dad's and my jewelry and rings and watches are to be sold - not Dad's watch (see paper about it) and money put to my estate. Boxes in my bedroom closet marked -

Keep Sakes or Personal of Dad's and mine are to burned please- burn them up at once and do not open. Please.

My real pretty cut glass bowl (a wedding present to Dad and me) is to be given to Franklyn Sr if he is still living and if he has passed on, then it is to be sold with rest of the things-and money put to my estate. Some of my wedding presents (Cake plates), one to Cecile and one to J C, Jr, if either of them have passed on the plates, they are to be sold and money put to my estate. I have already given Sugar Doll and Sunny Boy some of the things I had for them. See paper about Dad's watch- the watch in in my safety box at bank.

If any one or ones of my own children have died, their part is to be given to the one or ones of my own children that are still living. Children, please be nice with each other about all these things, and do about it as you know I would want you to do. Be kind and fair - I tried to be. All things in the 2 apartments on second floor of 309 Wendover are mine and are List of Gifts page 6

to be sold at auction at some time the things are sold on 1st floor, and is to be a part of my estate.

The money received from the above and the 2 insurance policies of mine with Commonwealth on my life, also any money I may have of mine in bank or any money I may have of

mine (it is marked) in my safety deposit box at Lincoln Bank and Trust Co or any other bank, is to be put to my estate. Please see that Baby Franklyn gets to spend his \$20 just as he wants to, and spends it himself, all on him-self and not save it., Maybe he would want something pretty to wear or whatever he wants and takes it with him wherever he is. It is his and no one elses. Someone help him please. I desire and plead that none of my heirs or any of their families ever own or live in my home 309 Wendover. This I ask with all my heart. Please children see to this, thanks. Everything of dad's and mine is to be sold except Gift List. Any money from any of it is to be put to my estate. These are my wishes children. With Love, Mother and Grandmother, (Signed) Claudine M Nuckols.

The \_\_\_ by figures on mantel in living room at my death belong to Franklyn and Mable without any charge. Baby in tub on mantel is to be sold for \$50 or under.

### Dad's Watch

To belong to both of the Boys  
J.C. Jr and Franklyn W Jr- Boys draw straws to see which on has it first, then each to have it 6 months at a time and take good care of it. It is to be kept in the blood side of our family and not to be sold. If one of the boys have passed on, the watch is to be given to the one, and if both have passed on, then the watch is to be given to Cecile. The watch is not to be left in the hands of any of the in-laws. When all three of our children, Dad's and mine have passed on, then the watch is to be sold and the money is to be given to the Baptist Orphans' Home. I am sure this is the way Dad would want his watch fixed, But I have a right to do as I want with it as he gave it to me before he died. Please keep this paper about the watch in a safe place or give it to Trust Company that has the (my) will.


At a County Court held for Jefferson County at the court House in the City of Louisville on Sept 5, 1957 was produced in Court the following instruments of writing purporting to be the last will and testament and four codicils thereof of Claudine M Nuckols, deceased, late of this County, who died Aug 5, 1957, a resident thereof; and all of that portion of typewritten material (dated Nov 24, 1943) including and beginning with the preamble through item V on the first page and Item IX appearing on the second sheet (being numbered 5) was proven by testimony of Norma Feathers, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, who also proved the attestation o Henry L Brooks, the other subscribing witness thereto and the same is hereby probated and declared to be the last will and testament of the said testatrix; It is further ordered that all of the portion of typewritten matter on a sheet of paper glued to the bottom of the original first page and entitled "Corrections and additions made to my last will and testament of Claudine M Nuckols on this May 2, 1957" and including items numbered VI,VII, VIII, be and the same are hereby rejected because the portion of the said will tendered was not witnessed and acknowledged according to the statute law of Kentucky; and said first codicil thereto dated Nov 24, 1953, and said second and third codicil thereto dated Nov 24, 1953 and said fourth codicil thereto dated April 9, 1957, each was proven to be in the handwriting of and wholly written by said testatrix by testimony of Franklyn W Nuckols, thereupon said instruments of writing were established and adjudged by the court to be the last will and testament and four codicils thereto of said executrix and ordered to be recorded as such, and I hereby certify that same with this certificate is recorded in my office as Clerk of said Court. (The above order of probate is entered Nune Proo Tuno as of September 5, 1957) Witness my hand this Sept 5, 1957, James W Queeman, Clerk by Sherrill Grebe, D.C.

### MINNIE NUCKOLS CUNNINGHAM

Minnie NUCKOLS was born 6/13/1889 in St Charles MO. And died 2/23/1924 in Jersey Co, IL. I is not known who her parents were because she could not be located in the 1900 Census. On 12/9/1908 She married Grant Cunningham 12/9/1908 in Vermillion Co, IL



Mrs Cunningham Found Dead in Bed  
Mrs Minnie Cunningham, wife of Grant Cunningham, of the Meadow Branch vicinity was found dead in bed Saturday morning at 2 o'clock. The deceased, it is said, had been in poor health for some time but her condition was never considered perilous enough to warrant medical attention. Friday evening she was not feeling so well and she was found dead that night by her husband. Coroner Brewster was called and conducted an inquest. The investigation revealed that death had been caused from a functional heart trouble produced by a systoma. Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Meadow Branch Church, Rev M J Wahl of Grafton officiating. The deceased is survived by her husband and seven children. Two children died prior to her demise. At the time of her death she was thirty-four years of age.
