### **C D NUCKOLS married Alice TAYLOR 12/30/1889 Sullivan Co, TN.**

There were no NUCKOLS families in Sullivan Co, TN in the 1880 Census. There was no Alice Taylor in Sullivan Co, TN for 1880. In Sumner Co, TN was an Alice Taylor b 1867 d/o Sarah Taylor. There was no C D Nuckols in the entire state of TN for 1880.

### **Ed NUCKOLS married Dana BELCHER 12/19/1878 Calloway Co, KY**

In the 1880 Census of Calloway Co, KY is the family of Moses and Mary Belcher with grown children. Dana could be their daughter. The only Nuckols family in Caloway Co, KY in 1880 was a Mulatto family with Ned as head of house, but his wife was not Dana.

### **E.J. NUCKOLS married Emma Hall 1/17/1897 Lincoln Co, ARK**

In the 1880 Census of Lincoln Co, Smith ,AR pg 80 is Emma Hall born 1877, dau of Joseph and Elizabeth Hall. The only Nuckolls in AR for 1880 are in Independence County and no one with initials E J.

### **Eliza A NUCKOLS married Thomas WARRILOSS 11/19/1840 Goochland Co, VA**

The 1850 Census of Virginia shows no surname WARRILOSS ar any variant therof.

### **Elizabeth NUCKOLS married Jesse WILKINSON 2/16/1807 Goochland Co, VA**

The 1850 Census of Virginia shows no head of household Jesse Wilkinson.

### **Elizabeth NUCKOLS married Thomas DAVIDSON 7/10/1835 Woodford Co, KY**

A search was made of the 1850 Kentucky Census. Thomas Davidson was not found in Woodford County. There was a Thomas Davidson in Barren Co, KY, but he was age 70 wife Catherine.

### **Elizabeth NUCKOLS married George MARTIN 10/6/1836 Jefferson Co, KY**

George Martin is found in the 1850 Jefferson Co, KY pg 223 Census age 41, wife Elizabeth age 35, children Mary Jane 11, Eliza A 9, Elizabeth 6, Sarah 68, (prob mother), Quincey Martin, 21. It seems they are next door to William Andrew Nuckols and family. (**Okay David, this one is for you:**) William was the son of Edward T. Elizabeth is likely Williams sister born c1814. We have tentively placed Elizabeth who married Talliferro Skinner as Edwards daughter and Williams sister. What is really WEIRD, is next to the Martin Family is Robert SKINNER and wife Catherine.

### **Elizabeth NUCKOLS married Samuel N ATTKINSON 11/29/1845 Goochland Co, VA**

A search of the 1860 Census of Virginia was made and found Samuel Atkinson in Hanover Co, pg 367 age 39, wife Elizabeth age 29 (b c1820), children Chisholm? D 3, Mary A 2m. Next to Harden Duke Nuckols. Could Harden have a sister named Elizabeth?

A William Henderson is found in Hanover Co, pg347 age 45 wife Elizabeth 44 (b c1806), children Thomas 16, Sarah E 15, Maud 12, Irene K 10, Permelia 8, Sophronia 5. With so many Nuckols in Hanover County, it would be hard to place the parents of this Elizabeth

## MEN IN THE MILITARY

### Jacob Andrew Nuckols

Son of Joseph Nuckols and Phoebe Watkins. He was born 11 Dec 1838 in Goochland Co, VA and died 5/23/1910 in Christian Co, KY.

Family legend says he was the bearer for Jeb Stuart of the Confederate States of America during the Civil War. The CSA Paid him \$1,000 for the value of his horse which was shot from under him during the Battle of Yellow Tavern, VA on May 11, 1864, the day Jeb Stuart was killed. He was twice taken prisoner and exchanged during the war. He was a farmer. He settled in Kansas with wife Nannie Rebecca Justice. His first six children were born near Richmond, Virginia. He then moved his family to farms first in Gracey, then to Bell Station (now part of Fort Campbell), both in Christian County, Kentucky where the last two children were born. He died May 23, 1910.

May 11, 1864

As the battle between Grant and Lee raged at Spotsylvania Court House, the Union cavalry corps under Maj. Gen. Philip Sheridan embarked on a cavalry raid against Richmond. After disrupting Lee's road and rail communications, Sheridan's cavalry expedition climaxed with the battle of Yellow Tavern on May 11. The outnumbered Confederate cavalry was defeated, and Maj. Gen. J.E.B. Stuart was mortally wounded. Sheridan continued south to threaten the Richmond defenses before joining Butler's command at Bermuda Hundred. After refitting, Sheridan rejoined the Army of the Potomac on May 25 for the march to the southeast and the crossing of the Pamunkey.

Result(s): Union victory

Location: Henrico County

### POINT LOOKOUT PRISON

A federal prison camp for Confederates was built on Point Lookout, Maryland, at the extreme tip of St. Mary's County, on the barren peninsula where the Potomac River joins Chesapeake Bay. The camp was convenient to the battlefields in the East and therefore became the largest Union prison. The camp was established after the Battle of Gettysburg to incarcerate Confederate prisoners. The camp was in operation two years, July, 1863-June, 1865.

The prison consisted of "two enclosures of flat sand, one about thirty and the other about ten acres, each surrounded by a fence fifteen feet high, without tree or shrub. The camp was only about 5' above sea level. Because of the topography, drainage was poor, and the area was subject to extreme heat in the summer and cold in the winter. This exacerbated the problems created by inadequate food, clothing, fuel, housing, and medical care. As a result, approximately 3,000 prisoners died there over 22 months.

It is estimated that a total of 52,264 (WOR) prisoners, both military and civilian, were held prisoner there. Although it was designed for 10,000 prisoners, during most of its existence it held 12,600 to 20,000 inmates.

The camp's Provost Marchall was Mjr. Brady assisted by Mjr. Gen. Benjamin Butler.

It is reported the guards were brutal in their treatment of prisoners. **Prisoner, John R. King said;** "Two days out of every three we were guarded by a gang of ignorant and cruel negroes. Please do not think that I dislike the

negroes as a race. Many of them are my friends, but the negroes authority over the white people and the defenceless prisoners suffered at their hands. Numbers of scars were left on the frame work of the closets made by negroes firing at the prisoners. The negro guard was very insolent and delighted in tantalizing the prisoners, for some trifle affair, we were often accused of disobedience and they would say, "Look out, white man, the bottom rail is on top now, so you had better be careful for my gun has been wanting to smoke at you all day!"

## NUCKOLLS IN THE LAW

# John Walton Nuckolls

John Walton Nuckolls was the son of Lewis Walton Nuckolls and Lucinda Wells. He was born 1 Nov 1841 in probably Robertson Co, TN and was murdered 2/28/1882. He married Laura Bunch Hopkins June 5, 1878. He only had 2 children, John born in 1880 and Asa Hopkins Nuckolls born sometime before he died. ( At the time of Asa's death it is said that he was written up in the New York Times as a famous atomic scientist)

From "The History of Tennessee" pg 852 Compiled and printed by Goodspeed Publishing Co, Nashville, TN 1882

Robertson County, TN

"Probably the most ably contested case in the history of the county was that in which S B Hopkins was tried for the murder of Dr. John W Nuckolls. The later married Hopkins sister. Shortly after the marriage, the couple moved into a residence in Springfield, the former home of judge True. After a short period of time, the couple began to quarrel constantly. Mrs. Nuckolls claimed the house was haunted. She would invite neighbors over, who would keep a watch with her and at intervals, tapping would begin on the floor under Mrs. Nuckolls.

Gill Walling, a young carpenter, was hired, presumably by Dr. John, to see if he could locate the source of the tapping. One night Gill hid beneath the house and found that the tapping was not coming from under, but above the floor at points where Mrs. Nuckolls walked in going about the house. It was discovered that she had a belt under her clothes from which an iron ball was suspended, this ball being attached to a piece of rubber which caused it to bounce as Mrs. Nuckolls moved about.

After living unhappily together for a time, they separated, Mrs. Nuckolls returning to her family home on North Main Street. Some time after, Dr. John went to the Hopkins home to see his son. He was denied admittance and a quarrel ensued which culminated in Nuckolls attempting to shoot his father-in-law. The defendant, S B Hopkins, was then residing in Nashville and upon learning of Nuckolls attempt upon the old gentleman's life, came to Springfield armed with a double-barrel shotgun. The next morning, February 28, 1882, as Dr. Nuckolls was passing down the street leading to the depot, he was shot by Hopkins; the prosecution claimed from the window of a saloon. The theory advanced by the defense was that Hopkins was on the sidewalk, and that Nuckolls was shot while attempting to draw his revolver. No one saw the shot fired, and much conflicting testimony was produced. The case was tried, on a change of venue, in Davidson County, and resulted in an acquittal of the defendant. Much popular indignation was aroused by the verdict, as Hopkins had a bad reputation, and had been acquitted of the murder of E C Kirk, a few years before."

## FOUND

It looks as though we have proven Herb Clark's connection after all of these years. It only goes to show you can never give up. If you just keep looking, you never know when you will find the clue that will make your connection.

Joseph D Nuckols born 6-23-1854 in VA died Mar 3, 1931 in Jefferson Co, Beaumont, Texas. He married Sue Bonham McConnico (1861-1941) c1883 in Texas.

He appears in the 1860 Buckingham County Census in the home of his step-father, Samuel Williams, and, in 1870, in the home of his sister Mary Agee. He is the only child not mentioned in the Nuckols family Bible, even though

several deaths are records well after the death of Joseph, his father. But he is listed as an heir of Nathan Nuckols in 1870. The obituary of Richard Nuckols indicated that a brother Joseph Nuckols was living somewhere in the west.

He is most likely the son of Joseph C Nuckols and Ann Elizabeth Garrett from Buckingham Co, VA

He is found in the 1900 Galveston Co, Texas Census with wife and children. When Herb gave us the children of Joseph, he included a son named Charles but no age or info on him.

John Knuckles (father unknown) married Cora Dickerson. They had son Carlisle William Knuckles born Sept 6, 1892. Having all of the 1900 Census records, I am unable to find this child in the 1900 Census. John may had died young, as Cora remarried to Z D Davis and died in childbirth in 1908. She is buried in the Morley Cemetery. She was born in 1868 leading me to believe John Knuckles was close to this age. Luther had a step-brother John b c1866 who their father (Caswell Benjamin Cobb) left in Missouri. Family lore also indicates John was adopted, which fits in with this picture, as he appears with the Green family in 1870 who was the neighbor of Benjamin Cobb in St Francis County, MO
